York County Family Cooperative Code of Conduct

The Code of Conduct outlines the expectations of all members of York County Family Cooperative during co-op meetings.

- It is the responsibility of parents to monitor and control the behavior of their children while involved in any event sponsored by York County Family Cooperative.
- 2. We ask that discussion and reference of political opinions, sexual orientation and gender identity be saved for outside of co-op. We build on our commonalities during co-op.
- 3. Students are not to have electronic devices at co-op during classes or breaks unless required for a specific class.
- 4. We will abide by all rules of the facilities we are visiting. No one is allowed on the stage in the sanctuary. No running in the halls, climbing on furniture or otherwise disrespecting the facility. Do not eat any of the church's food or drinks that are in the kitchen.
- 5. Please be considerate of others by being quiet in the hallways during classes and respectful of others' property and time.
- Be kind and respectful to everyone. Bullying or harrassment of any kind will not be tolerated.
- 7. No loud or disruptive behavior inside the church. Disrespectful behavior will not be permitted.
- 8. No crude gestures or profane language allowed.
- Children are to listen and be attentive to the teachers and parent helpers at all times.
- 10. Appropriate attire is expected during all YCFamily events.
- 11. If a student is disruptive in class, the teacher has the right to return them to their parents.

- 12. Students are expected to be in class, with their parents, or in the rec. room at all times. If students or children want to be outside on the church grounds, they need to be accompanied by parents ALWAYS.
- 13. Clean up after yourself. Leave classrooms and shared community areas as clean or cleaner than you found them.
- 14. Parents are welcome to attend a class with their child if needed. Parents need to adhere to the same rules as the children in class—no talking over others, no talking when the teacher is trying to instruct the children.
- 15. The only children allowed to attend a class are the children that are registered for that class unless permission is given from the teacher.
